Andrew Gurney joined the Treasury in 1996, having worked previously as a Senior Research Officer at the National Institute of Economic and Social Research and as an Economist at the OECD (Organisation of Economic Co-operation and Development).

At HMT he was the co-ordinator for the Treasury's economic forecast (1996-99), the Treasury lead on the countries that were seeking to join the EU (1999-2001), and part of the team that produced the Assessment of the Five Economics Tests of whether the UK should adopt the Euro (2002-03). Subsequently he has worked on a range of issues, including debt management, pensions, structural change in the UK and other OECD economies.

He was Deputy Director of the Macroeconomics Analysis team in 2011 and 2012 and is currently Deputy Director of the Government Economic and Social Research team, and is the Treasury's delegate to the OECD's working party on macroeconomics and structured policy analysis.
